2. Div. VII, CI. 17-0 through 20-24, 12 Any. Pictorials specialized to enamel buttons. $\$ 10, \$ 6$, $\$ 4$.

## Editor's Award

3. Div. IX, CI.7-0, 25 Any. Clear or Colored Glass, Specialized to one color. Use as many hues of one color as possible. Labeling and mounting in order required. $\$ 5, \$ 3, \$ 2$.

## Competition Committee Award

4. Div. IX, Cl. 1-0 through 15-5. 24 Any. The Three Amigos v.4. Assorted materials specialized 3 buttons made from 8 listed sub-classes. Example: 20-3-3 astronomical buttons, 20-1-3 architectural buttons, 20-9-3 Fops buttons, 20-7-3 Egyptian buttons, etc.... \$10, \$6, \$4.

## Jacksonians Award

5. Div. IX, Cl. 22-1.6.3. 20 Any. Stars. Closed figures with 4 or more symmetrically projecting points. Includes stellar variant. See page 60 of 2023 NBS Blue Book for definitions. No limit on studio or realistic buttons. Assorted materials. Astronomical scenes that fall under 20-3 are not allowed. In honor of Sue Marsh. \$50, \$25, \$15.

## Division I

6. Div. I, Cl. 7-0. 42 Small. Clear \& Colored Glass. Try for a complete representation of classes. In honor of those who love old glass! Julie Smith. \$15, \$10, \$5.
7. Div. I, Cl. 10-3 and 10-5. 42 Small. 21 small pewter and 21 small steel buttons. Carol Danhauser. \$10, \$7, \$3.
8. Div. I, Cl. 10-3. $30 \mathrm{M} / \mathrm{L}$. Pewter. Helen McCredie. $\$ 12, \$ 8$, $\$ 5$.

## Division III

9. Div. III, 36 Buttons-12 "small-smalls", 12 small and 12 med. Moonglows-12 sets of 3 buttons. "Small-smalls" must measure $>3 / 8$ " to $1 / 2$ " and fit within the Austrian tiny measure on a Linley measure.
